What wisdom from American country folk music! I have taught¹ quite a bit about the four simultaneous stages of spiritual growth and the archetypical symbols of metaphysics that describe them in our lives as we progress.

Turning in – the turtle
Simplifying – the snake shedding its skin
Seeing the bigger picture – the eagle
Removing obstacles – the elephant

John Prine's lyrics speak to a wonderful teaching for us these days. The poetic image of simplification speaks loudly to the truth that the most important thing in life is our relationship to God. Period. And the complexity of the world and sole focus on the things of the world distract us from the primary reason we have taken birth. The nature of the outer world is change and tumultuousness. To live successfully in this mayhem, we need to balance the outer life with a vibrant inner life that bring us fulfillment and peace, and not destructive, breathless chaos.

The lyrics speak for themselves however, there is a point of clarification which is the hidden gem of the poem. That is "try to find Jesus on your own." At first, I thought he was saying to eschew religious and spiritual paths. However, what he is saying is a very deep understanding of a profound and often overlooked truth.

I have to unpack a layer of two here. First, the concept of Jesus can be experienced in a relationship to a Divine personage, Jesus of Nazareth. And finding a relationship with this personage draws His loving consciousness to us in a beautiful life of devotion. The second understanding is that "Jesus" is a symbol of the Inner Being – many names: Inner Christ, Inner Light, the Teacher, the Guru etc. But cosmically, Jesus represents the **principle of evolution** that transforms us to the nature of the Christ – the consciousness of the Father within creation.

Finding Jesus, the God within, is ultimately a personal event. Religion and spirituality can't do it for you. They can provide much needed tools, but **only you are the craftsman**. Only you can sort out the unnecessary distractions and make time to "find Jesus."

So, "finding Jesus on your own" means making finding your SELF your responsibility and arranging your life to make sure that the finding will occur. Because the last day always
